If you encounter anything abusive, inappropriate or illegal online, here are some contacts

1. Google Safe Search go to [www.google.com/goodtoknow/familysafety](http://www.google.com/goodtoknow/familysafety) To report inappropriate sites to Google : [google.com/webmasters/tools/safesearch](http://google.com/webmasters/tools/safesearch)
2. On Facebook you can flag a photo or video by clicking the gear icon at the top right of the page and select 'Report this photo'. For more information go to [www.facebook.com/safety](http://www.facebook.com/safety)
3. YouTube can penalise users who violate its Terms of Use. Click the 'Flag' button beneath the video if it is inappropriate. For more information go to : [www.youtube.com/yt/policyandsafety](http://www.youtube.com/yt/policyandsafety)
4. British Board of Film Classification (BBFC): They work with filmmakers, mobile operators and on demand digital service providers to ensure that children only view or access age – appropriate content. For more information go to [www.bbfc.co.uk](http://www.bbfc.co.uk)
5. The National Crime Agency's CEOP Command: This agency helps young people who are sexually abused, or who are worried that someone they've met online is trying to abuse them. If this is happening to your child or worried that it might be, report it to CEOP at [www.ceop.police.uk](http://www.ceop.police.uk)
6. Internet Watch Foundation: If you come across child pornography or criminally obscene adult content on the web, report it to IWF. For further information go to [www.iwf.org.uk](http://www.iwf.org.uk)
